Integrating social work into general practice: Enhancing health and wellbeing through whole-person care in busy clinics.



General practitioners see the impact of social determinants such as housing issues, financial stress, mental health, and social isolation every day on their patients' health and overall wellbeing. However, dealing with these issues takes more than a quick consult, and there's often no time or resources in place to deal with these pressures properly. That's where social workers can make a real difference with their focus on holistic wellbeing grounded in social justice and human rights.

With funding from Northern Queensland Primary Health Network (NQPHN), James Cook University has expanded its **Social Work in General Practice** project, placing qualified social workers in five GP clinics across Townsville and Cairns. These professionals support patients with complex needs and chronic conditions, ease pressure on clinical staff, supervise student placements, and contribute to research that's directly grounded in practice.
